In April this year Margaret and I travelled to Egypt in a party of 54, mostly members of the Suez Veterans Association who kindly allowed us to join in their annual 10 day pilgrimage to the Canal Zone. There was a lovely service complete with the Last Post and for Margaret and I it was a most moving experience.

RAF AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE

Every aircraft In the RAF must have a maintenance log book known to all aircrew as the Form F70a and known to the Ground crew as 'The Pilots Gripe Sheet' This form has to be signed by all ground crew trades before the pilot will take charge of the aircraft. I list below some of the typical 'gripes' together with the ingenious answers from the ground crew. For ease the aircrew is symbolized as AC and the ground staff as GS. All with
